Margin of error	2 percentage points
Languages of interviews	English, Luganda, Ateso, Samia, Lusoga, Runyankore, Runyoro, Rutooro, Lango, Acholi, Ma'di, Lugbara, Luo and Kumam



The survey was conducted in 41 out of 56 districts. This represents 88 percent of the population.





Monthly Household Income























What is your relationship to the person who sends you money?










Do you own a mobile phone?















How frequently does your family member or relative send you money?










How much money – on average – does your family member or relative send to you each time?














Overall, how do you have a positive or negative opinion of the banks in Uganda?












Overall, how many people benefit from the money you receive from your family member or relative?










Other than daily expenses, what do you use this money for?
